BAG IT *or* CAN IT

WHAT IS YARD WASTE?

Yard waste is defined by state law as grass clippings, sod without dirt, twigs (less than two inches in diameter), leaves, and other yard vegetation. Yard waste is not: rootballs, soil, stumps, tree trunks, large shrubs, rocks, or bushes.

DO

use 35-gallon or smaller can with handles, labeled with a YARD WASTE sticker



DO

use a paper lawn & leaf bag



DON'T

bundle yard waste



DON'T

use plastic bags



BUT WHAT ABOUT BRUSH?

Larger branches (two to six inches around) can be bundled and placed to the curb as trash. One bundle of brush is allowed per week. This method is only for larger branches, cut to three by four feet in length and secured by twine or duct tape. Place your one bundle of brush near your trash bags or cans, not with your yard waste.

Yard waste stickers are available through MMWA or your local municipal office.
