



THE TOWNSHIP DIRECTOR



By April 1, 2020, households will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. You'll have three options for responding: online, by phone, or by email. **Very soon, you might see census takers in your neighborhood verifying addresses in preparation for the census.** This helps ensure an accurate and complete count. If you are visited by someone from the U.S. Census Bureau, here are some tips to assure the validity of the field representative: 1) Census takers must present an ID badge that includes a photograph of the field representative, a Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date; 2) they may be carrying a Census Bureau phone or a laptop as well as a bag with the Census Bureau logo; 3) if you're still unsure, call 1-800-923-8282 to speak with a local Census Bureau representative.

Why is the 2020 Census important? Getting a complete and accurate census count is critically important. *That's why your response is required by law.* If you do not respond, the U.S. Census Bureau will follow up in person to collect the information. The 2020 Census will ask how many people are living or staying in your home; whether the home is owned or rented; the age, race and sex of each person in the home and their relationship to you.

The Census Bureau will NEVER ask you for:

- Your Social Security Number
- Money or donations
- Anything on behalf of a political party
- Your bank or credit card numbers
