



THE TOWNSHIP DIRECTOR

Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Budgets Adopted

Rates for service were established for Carrollton Township's fiscal year which began April 1, 2019 and continues thru March 31, 2020. Fees, rates and tax collections provide the financial resources that allow the Township to provide services to our 6,103 citizens.

- The **General Fund** operates on a millage levy of **0.9134** along with State Shared Revenue
- The **Police Fund** operates on a millage levy of **9.20** - this is the same millage as last year
- The **Fire Fund** operates on a millage levy of **2.75** - this is the same millage as last year
- The **Garbage/Recycling Collection Fund** is funded thru a special assessment on your winter property tax bill. **The 2019 amount will be \$185.00** - this is an increase of \$35 from last year.
- **Water & Sewer Rates:** Your quarterly water/sewer bill is billed in units. One unit = 1,000 gallons. The water rate is \$4.81 per unit and the sewer rate is \$9.85 per unit. The Water Ready-To-Serve charge is set at \$12.00 per quarter and the Sewer Ready-To-Serve charge is \$15.25 per quarter. The Sewer Debt Ready-To-Serve charge is \$6.12 per quarter.

Blight Elimination is a Priority in Carrollton Township

The storage or accumulation of trash, rubbish, junk, junk vehicles, building materials, and the maintenance of blighted structures upon any private property within the Township tends to result in blighted and deteriorated neighborhoods, the spread of vermin and disease, the increase in criminal activity, and therefore is contrary to the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of Carrollton Township. Board members continue to “**Fight the Blight**” by having the Code Enforcement Officer target any issues which include:

- ◇ **Blighted Structures** - homes/businesses with missing or broken siding, broken windows, missing roof shingles, gutters falling off, loose shutters
- ◇ **Junk** - includes parts of machinery or motor vehicles, broken and unusable furniture, stoves, refrigerators or other appliances, remnants of wood, metal or any other cast-off material of any kind, whether or not the same could be put to any reasonable use
- ◇ **Junk Cars** - any vehicle which is not licensed for use upon roadways, any motor vehicle which is inoperative for any reason for more than 10 days shall not be stored on any premises
- ◇ **Weeds & Grass** - it is unlawful for any property or premises to have any noxious weeds, nor any growth of grass or other rank vegetation. The presence of such at a height of more than six inches (6”) is deemed to be a public nuisance
- ◇ **Parked Cars** - No parking on front lawn
- ◇ **Storage of Garbage Containers** - All trash cans, waste material, debris, refuse, recycling, yard waste, garbage bags, or garbage shall be kept in a place not readily noticeable. Storage shall be away from places occupied by other persons. Any type of container capable of storing items specifically listed above shall be reasonably hidden from a citizen’s view from the road. Citizens shall take reasonable precautions while storing the above listed items so they cannot be easily disturbed by animals. Other than the time allotted by ordinance for collection; none of the above listed items shall be stored in the front of any residence
- ◇ **Dogs** - it is unlawful for the owner or any other person having the possession, care, custody or control of any dog to permit the dog to run at large upon public streets, walks and parks unless the dog is attached to a leash (not to exceed six feet in length) of sufficient strength to retain the dog in such a manner as to be kept under control of the person accompanying it. It is unlawful to permit any dog to urinate and/or defecate other than on its premises without immediately removing and disposing of any excrement in a sanitary manner (except for any leader, guide or service dogs). Dogs on an owner’s property must have a fence sufficient in height to prevent escape; or on a leash at least six feet (6’) in length and located where the dog cannot trespass beyond its owner’s property line or intrude within three feet (3’) upon any sidewalk, alley, street or other public area
