Fight the Blight Initiative Still a Top Priority

The storage or accumulation of trash, rubbish, junk, junk vehicles, building materials, and the maintenance of blighted structures upon any private property within the Township tends to result in blighted and deteriorated neighborhoods, the spread of vermin and disease, the increase in criminal activity, and therefore is contrary to the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of Carrollton Township. Board members continue to “**Fight the Blight**” by having the Code Enforcement Officer target any issues which include:

Blighted Structures - homes/businesses with missing or broken siding, broken windows, missing roof shingles, gutters falling off, loose shutters

Junk - includes parts of machinery or motor vehicles, broken and unusable furniture, stoves, refrigerators or other appliances, remnants of wood, metal or any other cast-off material of any kind, whether or not the same could be put to any reasonable use.

Weeds & Grass - it is unlawful for any property or premises to have any noxious weeds, nor any growth of grass or other rank vegetation. The presence of such at a height of more than six inches (6”) is deemed to be a public nuisance.

Junk Cars - any vehicle which is not licensed for use upon roadways, any motor vehicle which is inoperative for any reason for more than 10 days shall not be stored on any premises.

Parked Cars - No parking on front lawn.

Storage of Garbage Containers - All trash cans, waste material, debris, refuse, recycling, yard waste, garbage bags, or garbage shall be kept in a place not readily noticeable. Storage shall be away from places occupied by other persons. Any type of container capable of storing items specifically listed above shall be reasonably hidden from a citizen’s view from the road. Citizens shall take reasonable precautions while storing the above listed items so they cannot be easily disturbed by animals. Other than the time allotted by ordinance for collection; none of the above listed items shall be stored in the front of any residence.

We are asking **YOU** Carrollton to do your part in keeping our community clean and free of blight! Now that the weather is warmer - look around your property to see what you can do to improve its appearance! Thank you!

Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budgets Adopted and Rates & Fees Set

Rates for service were established for Carrollton Township's fiscal year which began April 1, 2022 and continues thru March 31, 2023. Fees, rates and tax collections provide the financial resources that allow the Township to provide services to our 5,750 citizens (updated population from 2020 Census).

- ◇ The **General Fund** operates on a millage levy of **0.9049** (which fluctuates due to the Headlee Amendment), as well as bi-monthly State Revenue Sharing payments
- ◇ The **Police Fund** operates on a millage levy of **8.0** which is a 0.95 decrease from last year
- ◇ The **Fire Fund** operates on a millage levy of **3.0** and remains the same as last year
- ◇ The **Municipal Street Fund** operates on a millage levy of **4.9536** which fluctuates due to the Headlee Amendment

Water Rates:

A unit of water is 1,000 gallons. A unit of water is set at **\$6.08** and the system ready-to-serve charge is set at **\$15.00** per quarter. This is an 11.8% increase over last year due to the increases in rates proposed by our water supplier, the City of Saginaw.

Sewer Rates:

A unit of sewage is 1,000 gallons. A unit of sewage is **\$9.85** and the system ready-to-serve charge is **\$15.25** per quarter. The sewer rates also include a debt ready-to-serve charge that's been set at **\$6.12** per quarter. These are the same sewer rates as last year.

Trash Collection Rate:

The 2022 trash levy is set at **\$205.00** per residential housing unit. This levy pays for your curbside trash, recycling and yard waste pickup for the entire year. This levy also pays for the seasonal brush pickup provided by the Township's Department of Public Works (DPW). This is a \$20 increase from last year. **Brush Pickup scheduled dates for 2022 are: April 25, May 23, June 20, August 22, September 26 and October 24** (please note there is *no* pickup in July). **REMINDER:** Brush pickup is for larger branches that can't be cut up and put in bags/barrels on Thursday for the weekly Yard Waste pickup. Brush pickup is for branches between 2"- 6". Place at the road with the cut ends facing out prior to 7am on above scheduled dates.
